## 2025 Year in Review

As we reflect on 2025, one case continues to represent the heart of our work.

In June, a dog (later named Danny) was found abandoned on the side of the road in a crate. He was missing much of his hair and was in poor physical condition. Whether due to untreated skin disease, neglect, or prolonged stress, it was clear he had not received the care he needed.

From the moment Danny entered our shelter, our team began medical treatment and consistent patient care. Over the following months, his condition steadily improved. His skin healed, his coat began to grow back, and his confidence slowly returned. His physical transformation has been remarkable.

Danny has not yet been adopted. He remains in our care, healthy, stable, and still waiting for the right home.

His story reflects both the complexity and the commitment required in animal welfare work. Healing is often just the first step. Placement can take time, but our responsibility doesn't end when the emergency is over.

In 2025, our public spay-and-neuter clinic remained a vital service for Hancock County and surrounding communities. We provided

services to **573** publicly owned dogs and cats, helping prevent unwanted litters and increasing access to affordable veterinary care.

This work played a direct role in reducing future shelter intake and strengthening responsible pet ownership within our community.

As we entered 2026, our veterinary services were temporarily impacted by a medical emergency within our team. While our public clinics are paused, we're evaluating sustainable ways to continue meeting this important community need.

Beyond medical services, we continued expanding support in several key areas:

Grief Support Meetings, offering structured guidance for individuals navigating pet loss

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Pet Food Assistance, ensuring families in financial hardship could keep their pets fed and in their homes

Ongoing adoption, fostering, and partnership efforts to serve homeless animals

Our community events, including the Kitten Shower, Maxwell Meyers Memorial Golf Classic, Barks & Brews, Paddles for Pets Pickleball Tournament, and Tricks, Treats & Tails, continued to strengthen engagement and visibility across the county.

In 2025, hundreds of animals received care, medical treatment, and second chances. As we move through 2026, our focus remains on maintaining stability, strengthening operations, and continuing to serve both animals and the people who depend on us.

Danny is still waiting to find his forever family. But he is no longer the dog found abandoned in a crate. He is healthy, resilient, and a daily reminder of why this work matters.

- Our new veterinarian is doing public surgeries 2 days a week.
- Medical will be moving into the old board room after the first of March. Public surgeries will come in through there with better customer service.
- We are waiting on \$84,948 from the government.
- Austin is leaving March 21 to move back to Michigan where he is from.
- The sound mitigation work has been completed.
- There will be insulation added to the building in Animal Control.

Joyce called for approval of the 2024 Annual Meeting minutes. Diana, so moved. Pam, seconded. There was no discussion or changes. The minutes were approved.
